CONCRETE PIPE COMPANY TO DOUBLE CAPACITY OF PLANT

By the purchase of the Eagle livery barn property the Concrete Pipe company which was recently incorporated has arranged for the doubling of the capacity of its plant. This it was found is necessary to keep pace with the demand for its product. The new company is headed by C. E. Bingham, president; Phil Easterday of Portland, vice-president, and Harlie Jenne of this city secretary-treasurer.

The barn of the Eagle property is to be renovated, a concrete floor laid and addition equipment located therein so that the company will be able to turn out a great deal more work. All of the old fences of the corrals are to be removed and that space leveled and used for storage and seasoning.

During the past few days the company has taken a number of large contracts for drainage and irrigation pipes, including 2000 feet of large re-enforced pipe for culvert and drainage for the drainage district under construction north of Payette. Contracts too have been taken for carloads of pipe for Nampa, Weiser, and Vale, as well as one secured yesterday for Brogan.

To keep up with the work which the company has had before it almost constantly since it opened over a year ago, some six to ten men have been employed constantly. Besides the drainage and irrigation pipe the company makes concrete blocks for solid concrete work of all kinds. With its new property it covers the entire half block between Nevada and Washington avenues on the east side of Virtue street.
