Mrs. Paul Cayou of Nampa visited friends here the last of the week.

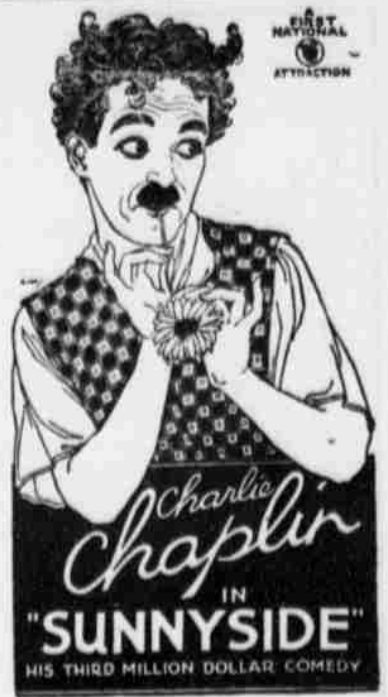
Mr. and Mrs. Alex McPherson returned Saturday from Portland where they spent two weeks visiting.
