"As you have previously been advised, the Government's force of stenographers and typists at Washington is so large that two or three hundred vacancies normally occur each month. It is only by maintaining a continuous recruiting campaign that the Commission is able to meet the calls for eligibles to fill such vacancies, and the Commission therefore requests that you continue to encourage persons to quaify for such positions. The Commission sees no prospect that the demand for workers of this class will materially decrease.

The entrance salary of stenographers in the Departmental service in Washington is usually \$1200 a year, and that of typists is usually \$1,100 a pear; which, with the bonuses which are authorized throughout the fiscal year ending June 30, 1920, make the total compensation, in most branches, \$1,440 and \$1,340 a year respectively.
