

## BOYS TO HOLD BIG MEETING AT WEISER

Young Fellows From 15 Years and Up—Called to Hear Inspiration Talks by Recognized Leaders in Boys' Work.

"Let's go," the slogan of the Y. M. C. A. boys' conference which started at Medford, Oregon, October 5 and will have continued at intervals ever since, will be carried into Weiser Friday, Saturday and Sunday, November 28, 29 and 30, when the fifth in a series of six will be held.

Every one of the conferences held thus far has been an unqualified success, both from the standpoint of attendance and results, many boys from 15 years and up having received inspirational help which will go far toward shaping their future. Letters are on file in the office of Paul L. Newmeyer, interstate secretary for boys' work at Portland, testifying to this.

The program for the meeting to be held at Weiser is virtually complete and is full of good things for the boys who will gather in that city for the three-day sessions. The citizens with one accord have banded together to carry through the series of meetings and all is in readiness for the big times that are on schedule.

There will be literary and musical numbers in plenty, fine addresses by specialists on various subjects and athletics, discussions of topics near to the boy heart, in which they themselves will take part.
