

NOTICE OF SALE OF MALHEUR COUNTY PERMANENT ROAD CONSTRUCTION BONDS.

\$100,000 Par Value and Accrued Interest.
 NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that sealed bids will be received by the County Court of Malheur County, State of Oregon, at the County court room, in the court house at Vale in Malheur County, State of Oregon, on the 22nd day of December, 1919, up to the hour of 10 o'clock A. M. of said day, for the sale of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) bonds, par value, of said County in series, as follows, to-wit:

\$4,000.00 of series "A" to run and be payable four years from December 1st, 1919;
 \$5,000.00 of series "B" to run and be payable six years from December 1st, 1919;
 \$6,000.00 of series "C" to run and be payable eight years from December 1st, 1919;
 \$5,000.00 of series "D" to run and be payable ten years from December 1st, 1919;
 \$12,000.00 of series "E" to run and be payable twelve years from December 1st, 1919;
 \$13,000.00 of series "F" to run and be payable fourteen years from December 1st, 1919;
 \$7,000.00 of series "G" to run and be payable sixteen years from December 1st, 1919;
 \$17,000.00 of series "H" to run and be payable eighteen years from December 1st, 1919;
 \$19,000.00 of series "I" to run and be payable twenty years from December 1st, 1919;

All of said bonds to be in denominations of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), or multiples thereof, up to One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000), at option of bidder, and bear interest at the rate of five and one half per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually at the office of the County Treasurer of said County.

Each bid must be accompanied by a check, payable to Malheur County, certified to by a reputable, solvent bank in an amount equal to five per cent of the amount of the par value of the bonds bid upon in said bid; such check to be returned if said bid is rejected. If the bid is accepted, such check will be returned upon payment for and delivery of the bonds included in said bid; if said bid is accepted and the amount of said bid be not paid within thirty (30) days after the acceptance thereof, such check shall be cashed and the proceeds thereof shall become the property of said Malheur County.

Bids will be received for any amount of said bonds, of the several series, not exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000), par value, and accrued interest.

The right to reject any and all bids or to accept part and reject part, is reserved by the County Court. Address bids as follows: "A. M. Moody, County Clerk, Vale, Malheur County, Oregon," and endorsed on the envelope "bid for Malheur County Road bond."

Citizens of Malheur County will be given a preference right to purchase said bonds.
