**SCHOOL HOUSE WILL
BURN FUEL OIL NOW**

Warren Construction Company Turns Over Carload of Oil and Has Its Mechanics Transform School Boilers.

E. H. Bostic of the Warren Construction company solved the fuel problem for the Public Schools when he suggested to the board that his mechanics could transform the boiler at the heating plant into an oil burner and turn over the company's supply of fuel oil.

The mechanics will go to work tomorrow to renovate the fire box of the boiler and on Monday the plant will be ready to burn oil. The board will secure 17,000 gallons of fuel oil or enough to take the school thru the winter.

This action on the part of the board indicates just one of the ways in which the striking miners have lost in this strike for the demand for coal from transformed boilers will cease for years.

They are shown in the Night and Day Camp conducted by the St. Louis Society for the Relief and Prevention of Tuberculosis. 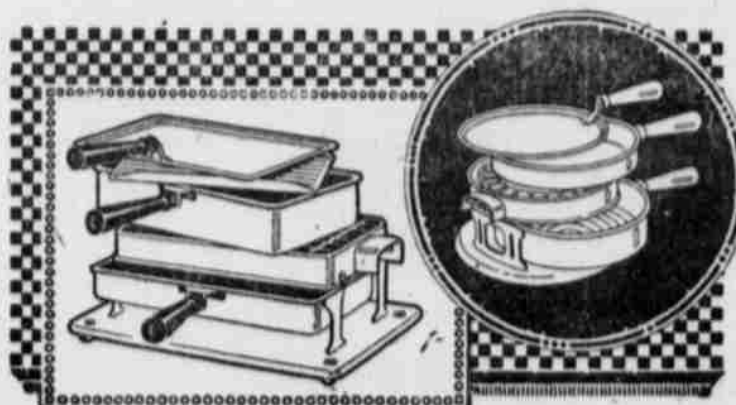
