URGE RED CROSS SEAL SEALS OPENS DEC. 1 DAY IN ALL SCHOOLS

Surgeon General Blue Asks That Churches Also Join in Movement to Further Sale

Surgeon General Rupert Blue has issued an appeal to observe Christmas Seal Day in the schools and in all places of worship in the United States, December 5, 6 and 7. The appeal follows:

"Over one hundred and fifty thousand Americans die annually from tuberculosis. This is an appalling waste of life when we consider that tuberculosis is classed as a preventable disease. Moreover, because this loss of life occurs almost entirely in the ranks of the young adult population, health authorities the world over have come to consider the control of tuberculosis as still the most pressing health problem confronting them. Every year the National Tuberculosis Association, by selling Red Cross Christmas seals, raises a considerable sum of money to be used in a nation wide campaign to combat tuberculosis. This year a special effort is being made to interest school achools, synagogues and churches. situation, I trust that the campaign A recent health survey resulted in this year will be particularly successful.

CHRISTMAS SEAL FUNDS

Within two weeks over a billion Red Cross Christmas Seals will be on sale in every nook and corner of the United States. These seals are sold to finance the campaign against tuberculosis in this country. Of every dollar received from the sale of Red Cross Christmas Seals, 91.7c remains in the state where the seals are gold for the benefit of the organized antituberculosis campaign in that state.

Out of the remaining 8.3%, the expenses of running the campaign are first deducted, and whatever is left is then divided between the American Red Cross and the National Tuberculosis Association

The Red Cross Christmas Seal cam paign is not for the purpose of financing the work of the American Red Cross or its chapters. It is for the purpose of financing the National Tuberculosis Association and the various state tuberculosis associations. The has been issued in the name of the Red Cross since that date. In March 1919 the American Red Cross agreed to allow the National Tuberculosis Association to use its name and em blem on the usual Christmas seal This year the Red Cross has no other part in the Tuberculosis Seal Campaign. The Red Cross Seal is a Tuberculosis Seal. Those who buy it are supporting the tuberculosis work in their own communities.
