

# RULES, REGULATIONS AND PREMIUM LIST ONTARIO POULTRY SHOW JANUARY 22, 23, 24

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The show will in all respects be under the control of the committee.
- Transportation charges on exhibits must be prepaid in full.
- Feed will be furnished and good care given the stock. It is generally preferred that exhibitors attend in person and care for their own birds, and they are especially urged to do so; yet those who cannot attend can ship their stock to the show hall, where it will receive good care and attention and will be promptly returned at the close of the show or otherwise disposed of as exhibitors may desire.
- The committee will not be responsible for losses or accident, but will take all possible care to prevent them.
- The Show Hall will be open for the reception of exhibits on Wednesday, January 21, from 9 o'clock a. m. until Thursday, January 22, at 9 o'clock a. m., by which time all exhibits must be in place.
- All live specimens except Games and Game Bantams, must be exhibited in their natural condition. Plucking, coloring or splicing feathers or any similar practices are in violation of this rule.
- Birds comprising pens must be specified by the exhibitor at the time of entry and recorded on the entry blanks. A breeding pen shall consist of one male and four females of the same variety and age.
- No persons are permitted to handle or take birds from coops without permission from the owner except judges or their helpers in the discharge of their duties.
- For the purpose of this exhibition the term cock shall be a male hatched previous to 1919, cockerel, a male hatched in 1919, hen a female hatched previous to 1919, pullet, a female hatched in 1919.
- All specimens exhibited for premiums must be the property of the exhibitor. No violation of this rule will be permitted.
- No exhibits can be removed

from Hall until the last night of the show.

- All birds must be leg banded.
- The latest edition of the "American Standard of Perfection of Poultry" will be the guide for the judges in awarding prizes on all varieties recognized therein.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

### Eggs

All eggs laid while fowls are in the custody of the Committee will be delivered to the owners, if present.

### Coops

Coops will be furnished by the Show, but if an exhibitor has his own coops the Committee will appreciate it if same are brought, thus assuring sufficient.

### Entry Fee

There will be **NO ENTRY FEE**. This show is not held to make money but to encourage the breeding of a better class of poultry in the community.
