H. C. Smith, of the Moore hotel, spent part of Sunday in Vale shaking hands with old friends there.

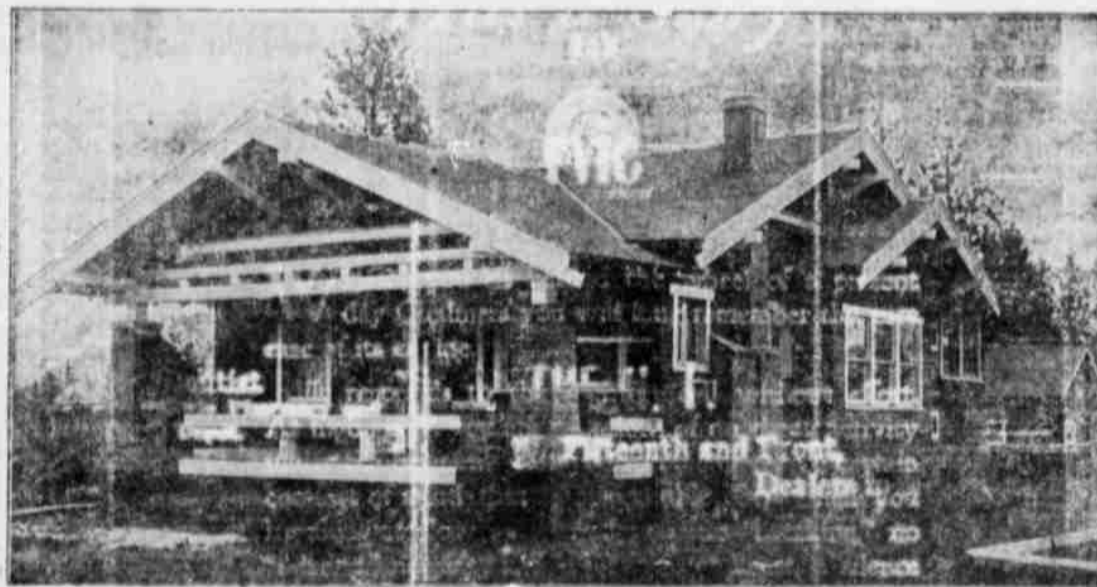
A. F. Riddle, of Boise, spent Sunday in Ontario on business.

To Mr. and Mrs. Grover Smith on Thursday, January 8 a son was born.

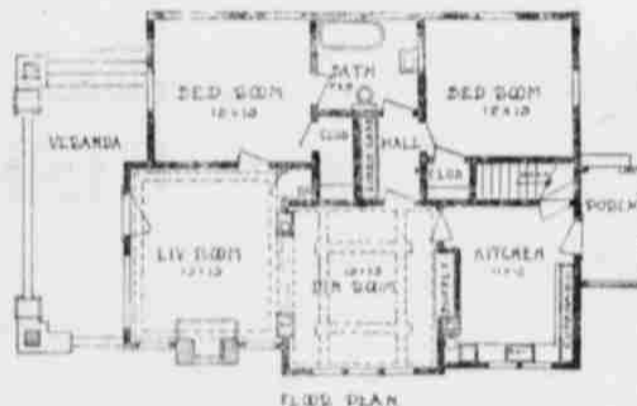
