## HIGHWAY DISTRICTS COMMISSION REVISES

Baker, Malheur, Harney and Grant Counties Form New State District, With Headquarters at Baker, R. H. Baldock, Division Engineer.

The following dispatch to the Oregonian relative to road work in Eastern Oregon indicates that there is to be a great deal of active road work done in this section of this state during the coming year.

Instead of one division for all Eastern Oregon, with one division engineer, there will be three divisions, and three division engineers. M. O. Bennett, who heretofore has had all the work of Eastern Oregon, will have charge of the Pendleton office, while the new established office at Baker will be in charge of R. H. Baldock. The following is the statement from Salem:

Because of the increasing amount of work under construction and contemplated in Eastern Oregon, the state highway commission today announced that it had decided to re-district that territory.

Division headquarters will be established at The Dalles, with C. C. Kelley, division engineer in charge. This division will comprise the counties of Wasco, Hood River, Sherman, Jefferson, Crook and Deschutes.

The work formerly handled by Mr. Kelley in Marion and Linn counties south of Salem will be included in J. L. Maled's division, and that north of Salem in Marion and Clackamas counties will be handled by C. H. Whitmore, assistant engineer.

Division headquarters also will be established at Baker with R. H. Baldock division engineer in charge. This division will include Baker, Malheur, Harney and Grant counties, excepting that section of the John Day River highway in Grant county, between Dayville and the Wheeler county line.

Mr. Bennett's headquarters at Pendleton will be maintained as at present, and this division will include Gilliam, Wheeler, Morrow, Umatilla, Wallawa and Union counties and the John Day River highway in Grant county, between the Wheeler county line and Dayville.

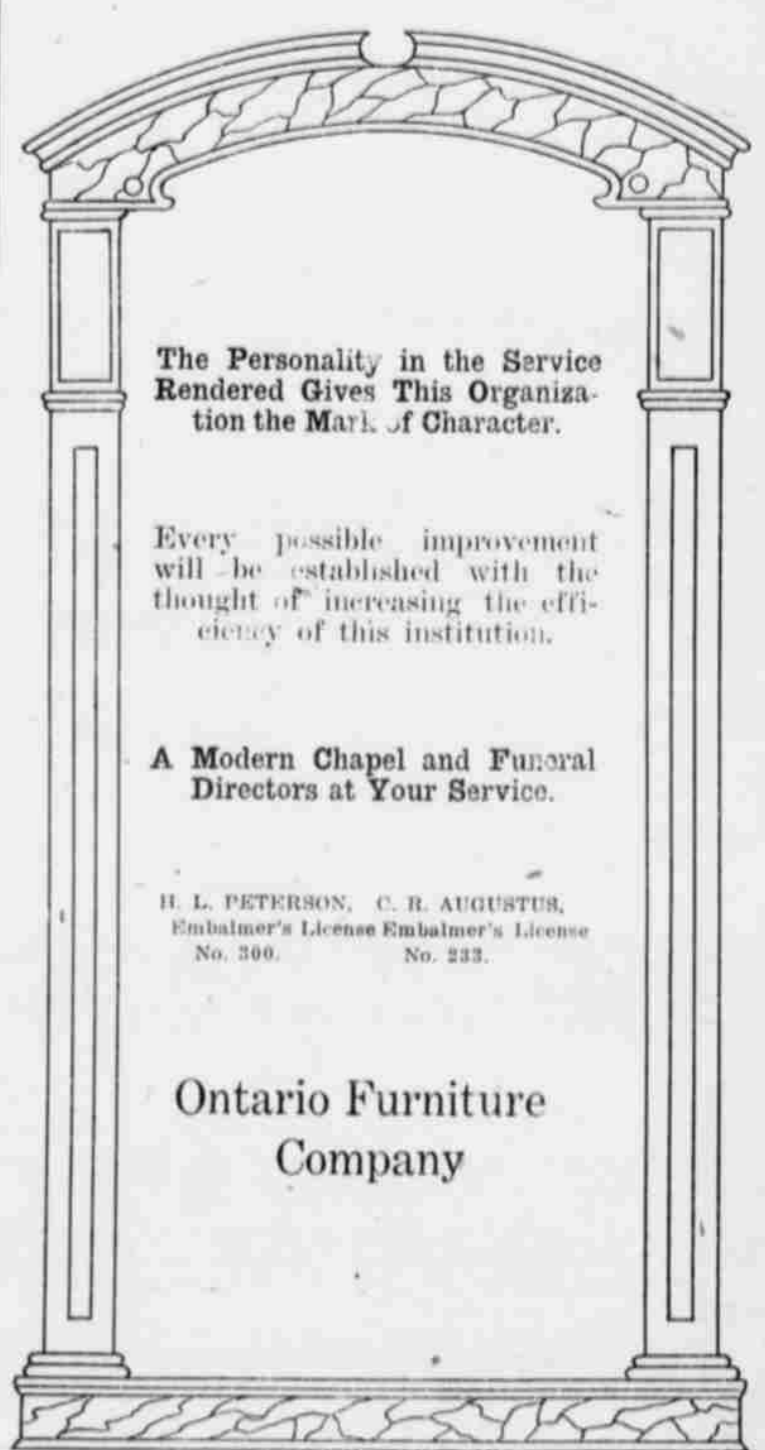
