125,000 STAND IN BREAD LINES

More Than 1,000,000 Face Death Is Message Brought by Miss Dakesian.

Imagine a bread line of 125,000 famished people waiting in line for 24 hours a day for the dole of food that is the sole barrier between them and death from starvation. That is the situation in Alexandropol, a city in Russian Armenia, according to Miss Hermine Dakesian, a pretty Armenian girl, one of the survivors of four years of the horrors of Turk-

ish massacres and deportations. Saved by an American woman, she has come to this country and entered Oberlin college.

With her came 14 other Armenian girls in charge of Miss Adelaide S. Dwight, a Near East Relief worker, who has been instrumental in helping to save hundreds of thousands of their people from death by starvation. Miss Dwight, who is not given to exaggeration and has seen conditions at first hand, says more than a million people are facing death by starvation in Armenia and will perish unless America aids.

Herself an eyewitness to the slaughter of hundreds of helpless women and children by the Turks and a victim of the deportation, Miss Dakesian, an unusually pretty girl, says there is untold suffering in Armenia and Syria. She praises the efforts of the Near East Relief, formerly the American Committee for Armenian and Syrian Relief, to save as many of these people as possible. At Erivan, the capital of the Armenian republic, one hot meal is given out daily, and by this relief alone the city's death rate has been cut from a thousand daily to an

average of twenty. At Alexandropol, where the refugees from Turkish Armenia were driven by thousands, the situation is appalling, Miss Dakesian says. It is to avert these wholesale deaths that Near East Relief is making a nation-wide appeal for funds.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE VIRTUE STREET, NOW KNOWN AS SECOND STREET.

NOTICE is hereby given of the intention of the Common Council of the City of Ontario, Malheur County, Oregon, to improve all that portion of what was heretofore known as Virtue Street, and what is now known as Second Street, in the City of Ontario, Malheur County, Oregon, beginning at the north line of what was heretofore known as Michigan Avenue, and what is known now as Ninth Avenue, Southwest; thence northward on said Virtue or Second Street to its intersection with what was formerly known as California Avenue, now known as Third Avenue, Southwest, in the City of Ontario, Oregon, by grading the said street with a proper sub-grade;

(2) By paving the same with suitable hard surface pavement for a width of twenty-four feet;

(3) By constructing and erecting concrete curbs and gutters wherever necessary;

(4) And by providing drainage facilities according to the plans and specifications which may be now, or hereafter, adopted by the said Council.

Said improvement will be assessed to the property adjacent to, and abutting upon said Virtue or Second Street, and notice is hereby further given to all the property owners affected by the improvement of said street, that the said Common Council will be in session in the Council Room at the City Hall on Tuesday, the 24th day of February, A. D. 1920, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock, P. M. for the purpose of considering objections to and assents against the improvement of said street, and the assessment of the property on said street, to pay the cost thereof, and all property owners as are adjacent to said street, and will be benefited or affected by the improvement thereof, are hereby called upon to appear before said Council at said time and place, and show cause, if any, why said property should not be assessed for the improvement of said street.

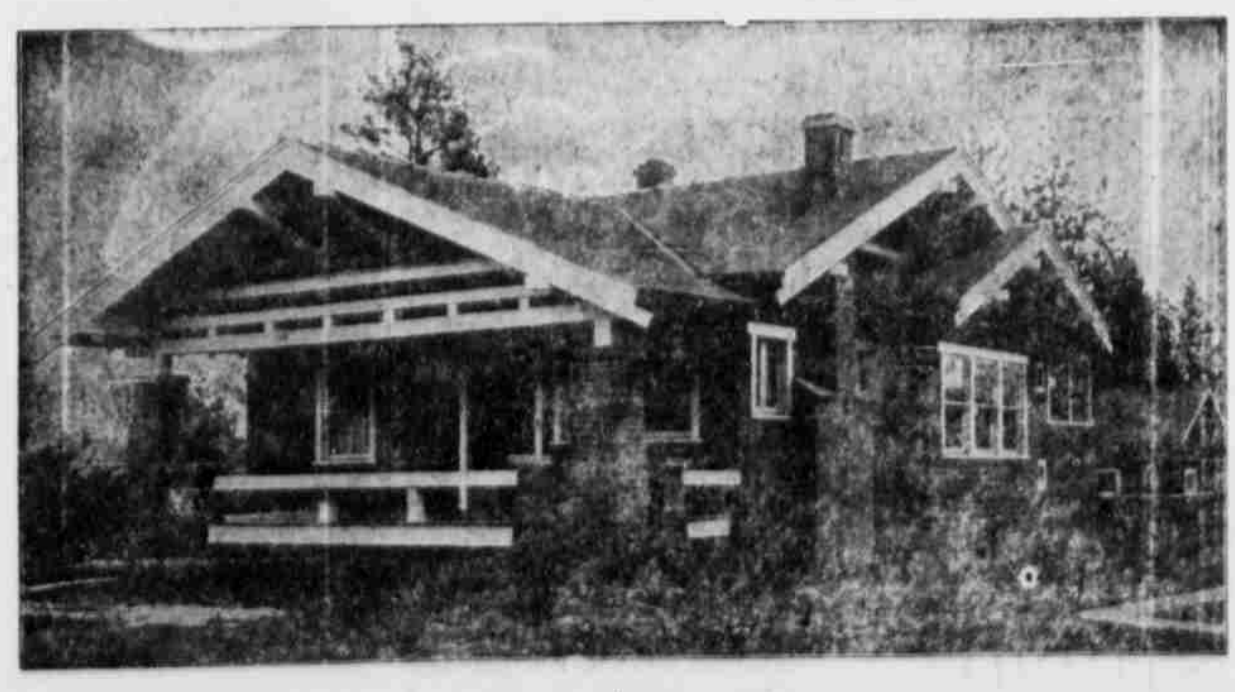
