Starting with Main, or what was Oregon street, the paving will go from Fifth avenue, S. W., to Third avenue, N. W., a distance of eight blocks, thence it turns west to Ninth street, N. W., the street leading to the Fair ground, grving entrance to the city from the Northwest, just a block from the point where the Old Oregon Trail will enter the city.

The lateral leading to the west to be paved is Third avenue, S. W., or what was California avenue. This will be paved from Main to Eleventh street, S. W., which is the street back of the Holy Rosary hospital. This will form an adequate gateway for traffic from the Boulevard region and the interior of the county to the west and south.

The East entrance will he effected by the paving of Idaho avenue, the hase line by which the city is divided north and south, from its interesection at Main to the city limits at East Fifth street and the County road leading to the interstate bridge. This road, by the way, is to be paved by the Highway Commission as its portion of the terminus of the Old Oregon Trail. By this work travelers to Ontario will have a paved road from the city limits on the east to those on the West. No other city or town in this section of the state has such a program before it this year.

Side Streets Not Neglected Besides these main thorofares there will be paving to the tracks on Second. Third and South First. Fourth from Main to the tracks. On First the paving will stop at the alley intersections, while on Second it will go to the passenger station and on Fourth to the west rall of the tracks. There will also be paving around the block bounded by Main street Second and First avenues, S. W., and First street , thus giving the City Hall a proper setting.


