

HURLEY READY TO GO INTO PRIMARY FIGHT

Trip Thru State Indicates That Wood Sentiment Is Forming Fast and Will Put Oregon in Wood Column.

Senator Julian A. Hurley, who is also Chancellor Commander of the Oregon Knights of Pythias, was in Oregon on his way home from a trip thru Central Oregon, visiting the various lodges of the order in that section.

While in Ontario he stopped over long enough to tell the Argus that he is a candidate for re-election to the Senate, and to observe that a visit to Grant county was satisfactory from that standpoint, for Grant, he said, will not put a favorite son in the field against him.

Finds Wood Sentiment Strong
Senator Hurley also said that he found the sentiment for presidential candidates pronouncedly in favor of Leonard Wood, so strong was his impression of the Wood sentiment that he declared that, in his opinion, Wood will carry Oregon by a greater vote than any two of his opponents combined will poll.

Concerning his own candidacy, he said that it would be predicated entirely upon his record in the past two sessions, and that while he understood that there would be a candidate from Harney county he was ready to go before the people on the record.

ROBERTS WOULD CARE FOR COUNTY'S CASH

Mr. Roberts came to Malheur county seven years ago from Indiana, where every one is in politics, or has been, or wants to be. Back there he was just like the other Hoosiers, he was in politics, too, serving as township trustee and county school superintendent.

Beside being a school man, Mr. Roberts is a rancher, owning a place eight miles west of Ontario on the Vale road. Since coming here Mr. Roberts has taken an active interest in school affairs, boosted for the Fair and otherwise identified himself with the growth of the county.
