The government has informed us that it will commence exchanging permanent Liberty Loan Bonds for the Temporary Liberty Loan Bonds on May 1st. We will exchange all bonds for which we have issued our safe-keeping receipts but those bonds which are in private safety deposit boxes should be turned over to us for exchange. All Second Liberty Loan Bonds should be turned over to us not later than May 16th. The permanent Liberty Loan Bonds will have all interest coupons attached to the date of the maturity of the bond.

EX-SERVICE MEN HERE ENDORSE MILLAGE TAX

As Taxpayers Who Will Not Benefit By the Provisions of the Measure the Ex-Service Men Declare For It.

In a strong resolution of endorsement the ex-service men of the Ontario Post of the American Legion went on record at their weekly meeting approving of the millage tax for higher education. This was not done precipitately, but after mature consideration. The arguments in favor and those against the measure were offered for the consideration of the meeting and then the men voted.

It is to be noted that the resolution was passed by the Legion men, almost every one of whom is a taxpayer, and all are men who are not in a position to benefit in any manner by the passage of the bill. In giving their endorsement the men declared that they did so because of the emergency that exists in the lives of the institutions of higher learning.

CITIES STOCK ARGUMENTS.

Editor Argus: A stock argument of the Socialists is that all laws governing economical questions are made in the interest of capital.

Occasionally, after thirty or forty years incubation of a question touching economical and moral affairs, the people arise and get what they want—prohibition and parcel post for instance.

License money from liquor sales permits paid a large portion of cost of city administration and the strongest opposition to closing saloons came from property owners.

Millionaire corporations were able for many years to defeat the adaptation of parcel post.

Now comes the area of road building and the manner of financing their construction is the leading question.

Capital says "put it on automobiles," and on them it goes while, as a matter of fact, more than 60 per cent of the cars on our streets and roads are driven by those who can not afford to own them. Thus again capital throws more than 60 per-

cent of millions expended upon public improvements upon the improvident and, like other great wrongs mentioned, it will probably take twenty or thirty years to remove this favor to property and place the burden where it belongs.

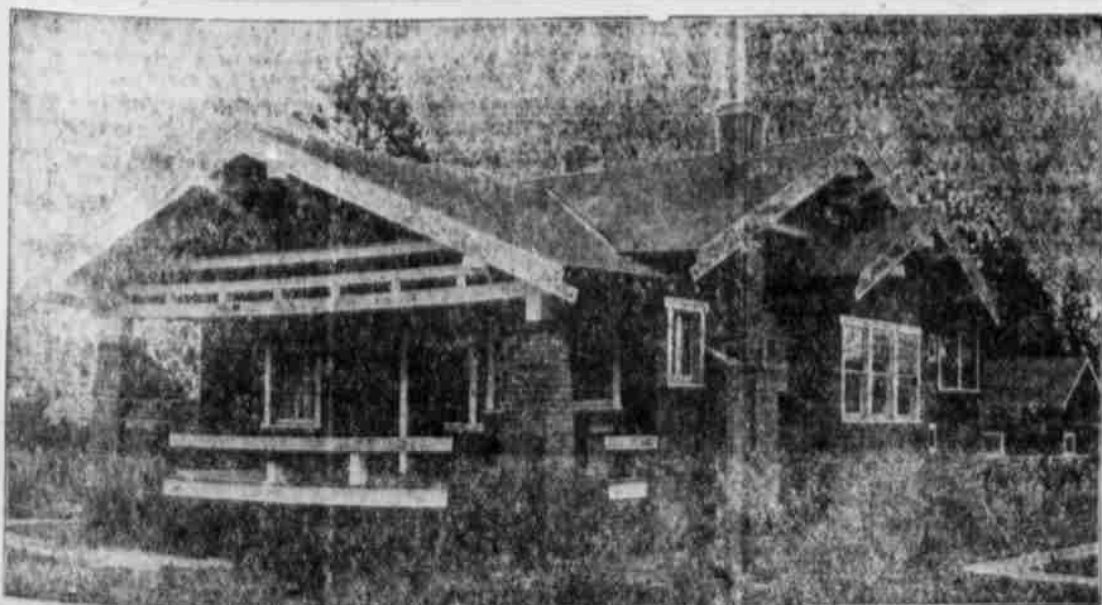
