Librarian, in speaking of the board's plan, says: "The library wants to help the people, and therefore standard lists of books will be sent to the branches and the stations, and Farm Bureau officers from which selections may be made. Any book on these lists will be bought by the county."

**Get Books by Phone.** Requests for books may be made either in person or by telephone or mail. On books sent by mail the library pays the postage one way. The members of the Ontario Library Board with which the County Court contracted for the use of the Ontario Carnegie Library building and books in the establishing this service are: Mrs. L. Adman, chairman, Mrs. S. D. Dorman, Mrs. E. M. Greig, Mrs. H. W. Clement, E. A. Fraser, Dr. H. H. Whitney.

The work of the Ontario Library will be carried on, and in fact the service which must be financed locally must be increased. The building will have to be open more than in the past and the work of the city librarian will thus be added to materially. Additional janitor service will be necessary, and repairs must be made to the building. To finance all these features of the work the local board is called upon to do, and is without funds for their accomplishment. Plans are being considered to meet this contingency, the nothing definite has been determined, as yet.
