Power and authority is hereby given to the council and the said council is hereby authorized to borrow money on the faith of the city to loan the credit thereof. or both, and to that end provide for the issuance of bonds and warrants for any purpose, which in the judg-ment of the council is beneficial to the interests of said city, and to designate the manner and time for the payment thereof and the interest thereon; provided however, that the City of Ontario shall not have power to issue its bonds for any purpose or to incur any ladebtedness (except bonds issued for public improvements) in excess of (40%) FORTY per cent of the taxable property within the city, the amount thereof to be ascertained from the last preceding assessment made for county and state purposes, and no bond whatever (except bonds is ued for public improvements where the cost thereof is assessed to the property specially benefited) shall be is-sued for the said city until the voters of said city, at a special election for that purpose, by a majority vote, shall deciare in favor of the same; provided that interest on said bonds shall not exceed six per cent per

That all persons over the age of twenty-one years, who are not allens and who are residents of the State of Oregon, and who have resided with-in the corporate limits of the City of Ontario for at least six months next preceding said election, shall be en-titled to vote at such special election and not otherwise.

In the event that a majority of the qualified electors of the City of On-tario, Oregon, vote in favor of said amendment, the same shall be in full force from and after the canvass the votes at such election by the Common Council and the proclamation of the Mayor declaring the re-sult of such election, and the section of the charter as heretofore amend-ed and adopted shall become repeal-

ed and void and of no effect.
