Notice is hereby given by the un-
 derdesignated Clerk of the County of Mal-
 heur, State of Oregon, pursuant to
 an order of the County Court of said
 County and State made and entered
 on the 24th day of May, 1920 and a
 further order of said Court made
 and entered on the 8th day of June,
 1920, that an election is called and
 will be held within the territory here-
 inafter described between the hour
 of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 3
 o'clock in the evening of July 8th,
 1920, at which election shall be sub-
 mitted to the qualified electors with-
 in said territory the question of
 whether or not said territory shall
 be created and organized into an ir-
 rigation district pursuant to the laws
 of the State of Oregon, to be called
 the Slide Irrigation District, and at
 which election the qualified electors
 shall be required to cast ballots con-
 taining the words "Irrigation Dis-
 trict—Yes" and "Irrigation Dis-
 trict—No" or words equivalent thereto.

That the boundaries of said pro-
 posed irrigation district as fixed by
 said orders are as follows:

Commencing at the NE corner, of
 SE 1/4, of the NE 1/4, of Section 32,
 Township 15 South, Range 47 E. W. M.;
 thence West along the East and
 West center line of the N 1/2 of said
 Section 32 to the West line of said
 Section; thence North 80 rods, to the
 Section corner common to Sections
 30, 29, 31 and 32, in said Township
 and range; thence West along the
 North line of Section 31, said Town-
 ship and Range to the NE corner of
 the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of said Sec-
