NEW SPRAY INFORMATION

IS FOR OREGON GROWERS

**Station Bulletin Outlines More Eco-
 nomical and Better Insect Con-
 trol Spraying Methods**

Oregon Agricultural College, Cor-
 vallis, June 22—Spraying under Ore-
 gon conditions—right materials, mix-
 ing application—is brought right up
 to the minute in a new station bulletin,
 Insecticide Investigations, written
 by A. L. Lovett, entomologist,
 and published by the O. A. C. experi-
 ment station.

Improving the physical properties
 of the spray by means of spreaders
 adds to its wetting and covering pow-
 er, and increases its adhesiveness,
 Professor Lovett declares.

Without a spreader the spray solu-
 tion rests finally on the waxy sur-
 face of an apple as an irregular,
 blotchy coating of uneven thickness
 with interspaces poorly covered or
 without spray. With a good spreader
 the final result is a smooth even
 inconspicuous covering, which af-
 fords equal and perfect protection to
 every part of the surface.

Casinate used with hydrated lime
 in the ratio of 1.5 to 3.5, mixed
 thoroughly and then reduced to a
 thin paste with small additions of
 water and much stirring, proved one

of the best spreaders. It is cheap and
 generally available in reasonable
 quantities.

To prepare 200 gallons of lead ar-
 senate spray solution requires 3
 ounces of caseinate and 7 ounces hy-
 drated lime. Very small amounts
 should be experimented with until
 the process of making the paste is
 learned. A chemical action takes
 place which is readily observed
 when it occurs. After seeing it once
 the grower will better understand
 how to make a desirable mixture.

**MOTOR RURAL CARRIER
 EXAMINATION TO BE HELD**

The United States Civil Service
 Commission has announced an exam-
 ination for the County of Malheur,
 Oregon, to be held at Ontario, Oregon,
 on July 24, 1920, to fill the position
 of motor rural carrier at Ontario,
 Oregon, and vacancies that may later
 occur on motor rural routes from
 post offices in the above-mentioned
 county. The salary on motor routes
 ranges from \$2100 to \$2250 per an-
 num. The examination will be open
 only to citizens who are actually
 domiciled in the territory supplied
 with mail by a post office in the
 county and who meet the other require-
 ments set forth in Forms 2121 and
 1977. Form 2121 may be seen posted
 at any post office in the county for

which the examination is held, and
 Form 1977 and application blanks
 may be obtained from the offices at
 which the vacancy exists and where
 the examination is to be held, or
 from the United States Civil Service
 Commission at Washington, D. C.
 The appointee to this position will be
 required to furnish, maintain, and
 operate a modern motor vehicle with
 a carrying capacity of not less than
 500 pounds and a cubic capacity of
 not less than 50 feet. Applicants
 must file with their applications a
 statement of the equipment they will
 be able to provide in the event of
 appointment. Applications should
 be forwarded to the Commission at
 Washington, D. C., at the earliest
 practicable date.
