STATE CHAMBER TO **EXPAND ACTIVITIES**

State-wide Appeal For Budget Made to Provide For Development Program.

Third-The intensive organization work at which time a state-wide can vass will be made, county by county. to raise a budget to enable the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce to carry on its program of development work for the state on a broader, more comprehensive scale. This canvass will be ade throughout the state during June

This budget is to be obtained by popular subscription. The appeal will state-wide and to everyone interestd in the development of Oregon and is particular community.
