



IDAHO AND UTAH UNIVERSITIES TO BATTLE IN BOISE

Football Teams of Two Institutions to **Clash at State Fair Grounds** on Armistice Day.

BIG ATTENDANCE PREPARED FOR

Minimum of 4,000 Expected; Old Favorites From Many Towns Playing; High School Boys Guests.

Boise .- From all over Idaho, interest is being centered on the Armistice day football game to be played, November 11, between the University of Idaho and the University of Utah. Four thousand persons, at the very fewest, are expected to attend. Fans predict that the game will be the biggest in the history of southern Idaho. The gridiron will be laid out at the state fair grounds.

Many towns, both in south and north Idaho, have their old high school stars on the Idaho team. People from remote sections of the state already have indicated their intention to see the two elevens clash. A delegation of at least 100 from Moscow is in view.

High school players from various towns will be admitted to the side ines to watch the contest, under supervision of their own coaches, who will show the students how the big
