**OREGON NEWS NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST**

**Principal Events of the Week Briefly Sketched for Information of Our Readers.**

There are eight inches of snow in the mountains south of Pilot Rock.  
The Jackson county farm bureau, with 700 members, has the largest farm bureau in the state.  
Cottage Grove mills report that the car situation, although greatly improved, has not yet attained normal.  
It is expected the general average of taxes this year in the towns of Coos Bay county will not be short of 5 per cent.  
Because of a scarcity of stock the planing mill of the Willamette Valley Lumber company at Dallas has closed down.  
Paving of 11 blocks of Pendleton city streets will start next week and bids have been made on four more blocks.  
Lloyd Heyne, 19-year-old Albany boy, was killed in an automobile accident on the Cascadia road, four miles from Foster.  
Frank Clingman, 53, a farmer who lives two miles southeast of Peoria, was killed when his tractor fell back upon him.  
Herman Pregar, Oak Grove rancher, killed two fat bears near Hood River after they had killed two of Mr. Pregar's sheep.  
A hill of potatoes on the property of J. F. Harris in Mountain View addition to Oregon City produced 78 good sized potatoes.  
A professionally trained secretary, E. F. Van Schoek, has been engaged to manage the affairs of The Dalles chamber of commerce.  
To reduce the working force to the basis of a year ago, 15 men in the Southern Pacific railroad shops at Albany have been laid off.  
Eighty thousand lambs have been purchased and shipped from Lakeview since September 1 by a sheep-buying concern of Salt Lake city.  
Walter Kalno, 36, will probably die of a wound received from a rifle in the hands of T. M. Colver, a neighbor, who mistook him for a deer.  
On account of the low price of starch and potatoes being scarce at Beaverton, the Pacific Potato Starch company will not operate there this season.  
A general farm products show, to be held in Eugene December 13 to 18, is being planned by the agricultural council of the county grange.  
State highway bonds in the sum of \$1,500,000 will be sold at a meeting of the state highway commission to be held in Portland November 6.  
Within a month an iron foundry will be in operation at Cottage Grove by James Peeney. It will be able to handle a casting up to three tons.  
Robbers dynamited the safe in the store of John Hedden, postmaster and pioneer merchant of Scottsburg, and escaped with between \$20,000 and \$30,000.  
Rumor has it that 1500 men will find employment in the construction of the railway from Willamina to Grande Ronde before the winter is over.  
Marshfield and North Bend American Legion post jointly will observe the second anniversary of Armistice day with ceremonies and entertainment.  
Commercial organizations in conjunction with the county court have let a contract for 30,000 booklets to be used in advertising the resources of Coos county.  
The county board of equalization has increased the assessment against the four principal corporations operating in Clackamas county by over half a million dollars.  
The teacher shortage is not so great this year as it was last year, according to J. C. Almack, assistant director of the extension division of the University of Oregon.  
A number of stock raisers at The Dalles are planning on entering thoroughbred stock at the International livestock exhibit which will be held in Portland next month.  
Absolute prohibition of Japanese immigration was urged by George A. White, adjutant-general of Oregon in an address to members of the Albany post of the American Legion.  
A corn show will be held in the community house in Albany, Armistice day November 11, under the direction of the Linn county farm bureau and the Albany chamber of commerce.  
The Salem water supply is pure and was not in any way responsible for the several cases of typhoid fever at present prevalent in Salem, according to Dr. R. E. Pomeroy, city health officer.  
The Colton Water company of Colton, has filed with Percy Copper, state engineer, application covering the appropriation of water from Canyon creek for domestic and irrigation purposes. This development contemplates the construction of an eight-inch pipeline, approximately two miles in length.
