The peace pact signed by Italy and Jugo-Slavia caused considerable satisfaction in Paris, particularly in official circles.

The home shortage in Iowa was estimated at 35,000 dwellings by E. H. Handa, state housing commissioner, at a hearing conducted by the senate.

The republican national campaign cost \$3,416,000, according to figures given out by Fred W. Upton, treasurer of the republican national committee.

Consumers of soft drinks have paid through the manufacturers of such beverages the past 11 months \$51,000,000 to the revenue department of the government.
