U. OF O. MEDICAL SCHOOL

MAY SECURE EASTERN AID
University of Oregon, Eugene, November 8.—President P. L. Campbell, Dean Richard B. Dillehunt, of the School of Medicine, and Dr. Harry B. Torrey, head of the pre-medical department of the University and director of the medical research, have left for New York, where they will confer with representatives of the general education board in regard to cooperation between this board and the University School of Medicine. The board has a large fund available for assisting established medical institutions in medical education and research and it is hoped to secure an appropriation for the University of Oregon Medical School. President Campbell will also attend and participate in the annual meeting of the National Association of State Universities, which meets in Washington on November 12.
