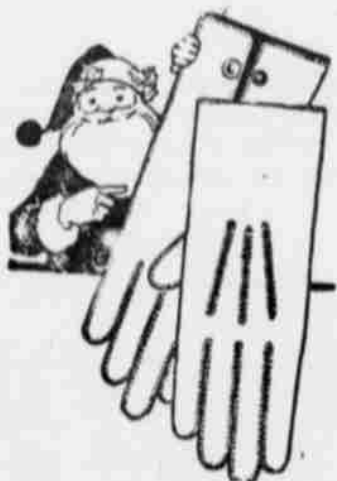

### "EXPERIENCE" IS COMING

The boy, discouraged but not beaten, determines to go back to Love and the little country cottage, and with his new friend Experience, he returns to Love, having lost the first fight, but having won the greater victory by conquering the evils in his own heart.
