EARLY PLOWING IS BEST FOR WHEAT

Six and a half bushels more wheat was produced per acre at the Moore branch experiment station farm from summer fallow lands plowed April 1 than on similar land plowed June 1. The gain of April 1 over May 1 plowing was 2 1/2 bushels per acre. The gains are averages of eight years' trials. The average yield for the period is given by D. E. Stephens, superintendent, as follows: Plowed April 1, 28.7 bushels; plowed May 1, 26.2; plowed June 1, 22.2 bushels. Lands plowed early in the fall with a moldboard plow yielded practically the same as the land plowed May 1, and lands plowed late in the fall averages the same yield as those plowed June 1. In either spring or fall plowing for summer fallow the early plowing brought higher yields.

LAYING BLOOD TELLS

"Blood Will Tell" is the heading under which James Dryden, Professor of Poultry husbandry at O. A. C., describes the success of a Pacific coast millionaire and an expert poultryman in running one of the biggest trap-nested flocks in the world, in the Country Gentlemen for October 23. The investment in the business is \$63,000. Eggs from one of the breeding pens sell at \$2 each. One illustration shows a day's egg production 5895 eggs from 9322 hens. The breeding stock was from high-record, trap nested hens with long pedigrees behind them, and Professor Dryden calls this use of them "putting heredity to work." He has written a number of special poultry articles for the Country Gentlemen and is preparing still others.
