

NOTICE OF BOND SALE
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That Slide Irrigation District, Malheur County, State of Oregon, intends to issue, negotiate and sell, and hereby invites sealed bids for, the negotiable coupon bonds of said Slide Irrigation District, First Series authorized at an election held within said district on October 11th, 1920, in the amount of Ninety Five Thousand Dollars, the funds to be derived therefrom to be used for defraying the necessary expenses of organization of said district, construction of works and system and maintenance and operation of the same, or any one or more of said purposes.

All bids for said bonds must be sealed bids filed with I. Yant, Secretary of Slide Irrigation District of Weiser, Idaho, on or before the hour of 2 o'clock P. M. on the 23rd day of March, 1921, at which said hour all bids will be opened, and must be accompanied by an unconditional certified check in the sum of 3% of the price bid, said check to be held as liquidated damages by Slide Irrigation District in the event the bidder refuses to take up and pay for said bonds if said bid is accepted.

Each bid shall specify the rate of interest, and the price in lawful money of the United States of America bid for (A) bonds not bearing the certificate of the Securities Commission of the State of Oregon, (B) bonds bearing the certificate of the Securities Commission of the State of Oregon, and (C) bonds bearing the certificate of the Securities Commission of the State of Oregon and upon which interest is guaranteed by the State of Oregon for not to exceed three years, or for either of the same.

The said bonds shall be negotiable in form, and payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weights and fineness, or in its equivalent, and shall bear date the 1st day of January, 1921 and shall bear interest not to exceed 6% per annum, payable semi-annually, said bonds to be in denominations of not less than \$100.00 or more than \$1,000.00, with interest coupon attached for each semi-annual installment of interest, the principal of said bonds to mature serially in annual amounts approximately equal, principal and interest, in not less than ten years nor more than twenty years after date.

The Board of Directors reserves the right to reject any and all bids offered, but if said bonds are sold will deliver the same free of exchange or transportation charges to any city of the United States, the purchaser to furnish the lithographed bonds and to remit the purchase price free of exchange to the bank to be designated by the seller.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That the County dog tax for the year 1921 is now due and payable to the County Clerk, as follows:
Males or spayed females, \$1.00 each
Females, 2.00 each
"Any owner or keeper of a dog or dogs who shall fail to apply for, or fail to pay said license fee, shall pay a fine of \$10.00 for each offense" (Laws of Oregon, 1919, Sec. 184). This Act also provides that any dog not wearing a collar having thereon the license tag shall be considered an outlaw and shall be killed by any peace officer.
Application may be made in person or in writing, accompanied by the proper fees, and stating the length of collar desired, to the office of the County Clerk and license will be mailed to you.
