NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That Slide Irrigation District, Malheur County, State of Oregon, intends to issue, negotiate and sell, and hereby invites sealed bids for, the negotiable coupon bonds of said Slide Irrigation District, First Series authorized at an election held within said district on October 11th, 1920, in the amount of Ninety Five Thousand Dollars, the funds to be derived therefrom to be used for defraying the necessary expenses of organization of said district, construction of works and system and maintenance and operation of the same or any one or more of said purposes.

All bids for said bonds must be sealed bids filed with I. Yant, Secretary of Slide Irrigation District of Weiser, Idaho, on or before the hour of 2 o'clock P.
