NOTICE TO EXTERMINATE GOPHERS

Every person, firm, co-partnership, company, or corporation residing on, owning, leasing, occupying, possessing or having charge of or dominion over any land, ditches, canals or other property, infested with pocket gophers in Malheur County, Oregon, is hereby notified to begin at once to effectively exterminate and destroy all such pocket gophers.

The following poison for mixing and instructions for use thereof is the method most expedient and effective to be used for the extermination and destruction of such pocket gophers, and is hereby recommended, to-wit, alkaloid strychnine used on either sweet potatoes or carrots, mixed according to the following formula and manner, to-wit:

FORMULA FOR POISONING POCKET GOPHERS
Recommended by U. S. Biological Survey and Extension Service of the Oregon Agricultural College

Secure one-half ounce Formula 1 B special strychnine, or in lieu thereof, grind together in a mortar: 1-8 ounce powdered strychnine alkaloid, 1-16 ounce saccharine.

Cut four quarts of sweet potato, parsnip or carrot bails one-half inch square and one inch long and sprinkle the above powder over them, stirring until each bait is coated thoroughly.

A bait may be also made for spring use particularly, by mixing the above quantity of poison with one-half pint of thin starch paste and applying the same to two quarts of wheat in a manner to coat each grain.

Introduce bait into the gopher runway by probing with a sharpened stick between the mounds. When the runway is located, drop one or two baits thru the hole and cover carefully so as to exclude light. Repeat operations after seven days on any place showing fresh work. It is necessary to get this poison into the runways or it will do no good to try to poison these rodents.

For this purpose a probe should be used, samples of which may be seen at the poison supply stations listed below and the proper use of which may be learned by applying to the undersigned at his office at Vale, Oregon.

The County Court of Malheur County has secured a quantity of strychnine and a quantity thereof has been mixed and is now on sale to farmers and other persons interested at actual cost and may be had by applying to:

If any person herein designated shall, within thirty days from the first publication of this notice fail to begin in good faith to exterminate, eradicate and destroy according to the method aforesaid, or by any other effective means, said pocket gophers herein designated, the County Court of Malheur County, Oregon will appoint a person or persons to proceed with the extermination and eradication of such pocket gophers, and the cost thereof incurred will be assessed to such land, ditches, canals, or other property, and unless paid will become a lien against same, for the extermination of said pocket gophers.

This notice is published pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided and for two consecutive weeks or three issues, and all persons described therein are required to take notice thereof.

PROCLAMATION By The Mayor

Whereas, the great essentials of a community, as well as an individual, is cleanliness and appearance, with cleanliness comes better health and with good appearance better impressions. No one who resides within the corporate limits of the City of Ontario, with that measure of civic pride that goes with good citizenship will deny these statements, then let us make a concerted effort to accomplish such result for the City we call home.

Now therefore, I, W. H. Doolittle, Mayor of the City of Ontario, Oregon, do hereby proclaim that Friday, the 22nd day of April A. D. 1921, be set apart as "Clean-up" day for said City and it is earnestly desired that all citizens make an honest effort to clean up their premises and deposit all rubbish, that is not capable of being wholly destroyed by fire, in piles along the alley line where it can be easily reached by teams for removal. Fires for the destruction of rubbish are permissible in the day-time only, and then to be watched while burning.

And further, I do recommend that the City Schools be closed during the afternoon of said date and that all places of business be closed from 12 M. until 3:30 o'clock P. M. of said day, so that the "Clean-up" of the City may be pursued with such earnestness that the best of results shall be accomplished.
