SHIPPING PROFITS DEPEND

ON PACKING AND GRADING Carelessness in grading, packing, and loading are largely responsible for the high percentage of rejections which occurs in the handling of of Lots 6, 7, and 8, Block 19, fruits and vegetables, say marketing specialists of the United States Department of Agriculture.
