POTATO SEED MAY BE SCARCE SMALL POTATOES DISEASED

Now is the time to lay in a sup-ply of seed potatoes toy next sea-son's use. Certified seed and other ed at this time. It is probable that good potato prices will stimulate production next year with the result the there may be a seed shortage next spring. Many may then be led to plant inferior small potatoes called "single drops." Three typi-cal hills dug from a tield infested total of five potatoes, four of them big enough for single drops. The yield per acre on these hills was at joining hill that was healthy had six marketable potatoes or a rate of nearly 500 bushels per acre. The pinnting of single drops coming from disease infested hills is cer-tain to result in seriously reduced yields.—Farm crops department.


