### WORK DONE BY MALLETT COMMUNITY POISONING RABBITS

The jack rabbits are being severely dealt with by the farmers of the Mallett district through an organized campaign going on there under the direction of Committeeman Poiles in cooperation with the county farm bureau. Rabbits are being poisoned by the hundreds and these leading the battle hope to put the pest to route in such a manner as to cut the loss of crop next summer as well as the loss of hay in stack this winter to a minimum. Already the community has pooled orders to purchase strychnine from the county agent at special prices made possible through the rodent control revolving fund, and they have secured an equal quantity of poison without from the Biological Survey donation to the farm bureau to assist communities which make clean-up campaigns. This work is also in progress in several other communities and a number of individuals are poisoning rabbits in various parts of the county with strychnine secured from the county agent.

Although the new income tax law increases from \$2,000 to \$2500 the exemption of a married person whose net income for 1921 aggregated \$2,000 and did not exceed \$5,000, every married person must file an income tax return if his net income in excess of \$5,000. If the net income of a married person last year was in excess of only \$2,000, March 15, 1922 is the last day for filing these penalties for those who fail to file by that time.

Every individual who had a net income of \$1000 or more during 1921, if single, or if married and not living with husband or wife, must file an income tax not later than March 15 1922.
