The time for filing partnership and fiduciary returns of income for the year 1921 has been extended from March 15 to May 15, according to Clyde G. Huntley, Collector of Internal Revenue. However, the extension in time which has been granted for filing partnership returns in no way affects the filing of individual income tax returns by the members of a partnership. Each member of every partnership is required to file a return of his individual income not later than March 15, regardless of the fact that the return for the partnership need not be filed until May 15.
