FRUITLAND BENCH FRUITLAND CHURCH TO BE THOROLY MODERN

Remodeled Edifice to be Dedicated Sunday—Nurseryman's Father Passes—Other Fruitland News.

On May 14 th the people of the M. E. Church congregation expect to have their red letter day. Bishop Buras has been invited to come that day to dedicate the church building as it stands enlarged. Under the pastorate of Rev. George C. Todd the people have built one of the most complete church plants in the northwest for the size of the community. The addition to the old church building with improvements in the main auditorium will cost about \$9000.00. There have been added several Sunday school class rooms, a gymnasium plant, a dining room. There will be shower baths. The bungalow, which adjoins the church is being remodeled into a six room modern bungalow with bath and furnace and when the church plant is completed the Fruitland Methodist people will have something with which to be proud. It is planned to make this a community center, and a campaign will be made to interest all the young people who are not attendants at any other church.

F. M. Carneff Passes
J. F. Carneff, well known nursery man of Fruitland, received word Sunday morning that his father, F. M. Carneff, aged 72 years, had passed away at midnight Saturday at Saint Vincent's Hospital, Portland, after week's suffering and an operation performed a short time ago. The father had rallied sufficiently, however, to roll himself around in a wheeled chair at the hospital but collapsed suddenly on Saturday. Mr. Carneff and family formerly lived at Fruitland and Ontario and are well known here. He leaves his wife, two sons, J. F. Carneff, of Fruitland, Milton Carneff, of Riggins, Idaho, Mrs. Marie Holland, of Pendleton, Oregon, Mrs. Nona Glazier, of Centralia, Washington. The body will be brought to Ontario this Wednesday morning accompanied by the mother and the funeral services held at the Catholic Church at ten o'clock the same morning burial in the Ontario cemetery.
