Mrs. Blake's Favorite Recipe

Devil's Food Cake

This cake is always popular and is a special favorite of men and boys:

4 egg yolks, 2 cups sugar, 1/2 cup water, 1/2 cup Carnation Milk, 1/2 cup butter or substitute, 1/2 tsp. salt, 4 egg whites, 2 1/2 cups flour, 4sp. baking powder, 4 squares unweetened chocolate, 1/2 tsp. vanilla.

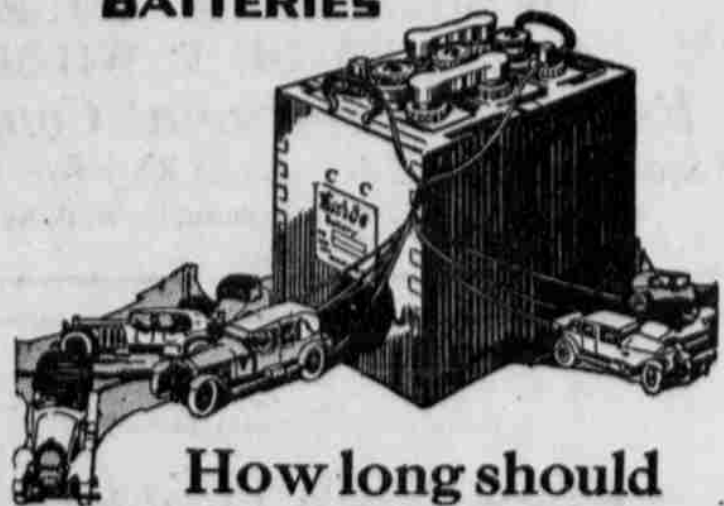
