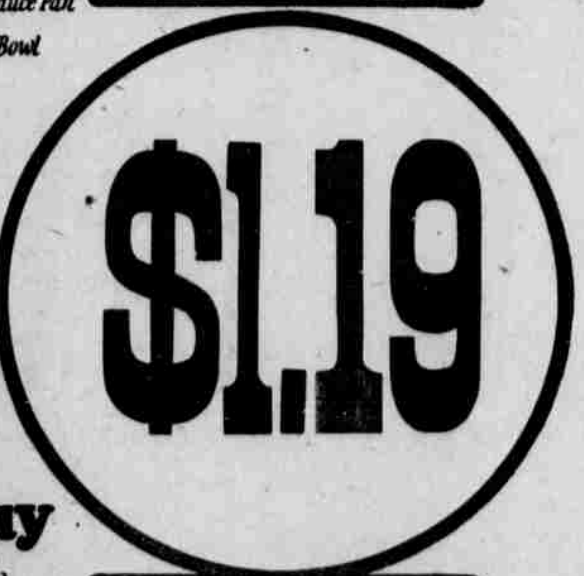

### THIS MIGHT SOLVE WEEVILS MENACE

If Plan Succeeds on Trees Why Not on the Weevil—Might Ask Department of Agriculture to Try It Out Here

The following editorial on pest control taken from the Salt Lake Tribune appears to have possible application to the fight against the alfalfa weevil. It might be well for the ranchers of the county to interest the department of agriculture in providing the necessary machine and attachments to carry on the battle.

This is the account as written by the Tribune:

Several interesting and successful experiments have recently been made in Ohio airplanes as sprayers of trees when attacked by caterpillars of other insects inimical to tree life. H. A. Gossard, Ohio state entomologist, thinks that one airplane can dust a strip of forest or of pecan orchard in less time than twenty of the most powerful liquid spraying machines can cover the area. The problem is to perfect dusting materials so they will give results comparable to those obtained with liquid sprays.

Mr. Gossard says that in France airplanes are being used as scout machines to discover the location of grasshopper swarms and then to scatter poisoned bait for the destruction of the insects. Several months ago the city entomologist of Cleveland, after experiencing great difficulty in spraying some closely planted large trees in one of the suburban parks, conceived the idea that such a tract could be dusted from an airplane. He communicated the idea to the Ohio experiment station and solicited help.

A hopper was designed by a specially detailed mechanic to carry about 200 pounds of arsenate of lead powder which could be emptied into the air by means of a series of revolving spoons operated with a hand crank. The hopper was attached to the side of the plane somewhat lower and behind the occupants of the cockpit, so that they would not breathe any of the dust. Besides the pilot another man was needed to turn the crank. The propeller and current created by the movement of the machine assisted by gravitation, distributed the dust, which was caught by the wind and carried through the top of the trees.

Mr. Gossard also mentions the success met with by the airplane in destroying a caterpillar pest which was defoliating a grove of catalpa trees, six acres in extent, at Troy, Ohio. The airplane passed about fifty feet out from one side of the grove and twenty-five feet above the tops of the trees. A strong wind carried the dust over the entire grove, nearly 400 feet wide, and it could be found in easily perceptible quantities on weeds and grass for 150 feet in the pasture on the distant side of the grove. Effective dusting, therefore, was done over a width of about 600 feet, or at the rate of about ten acres per minute. Perfected apparatus is expected to increase this service to thirty acres per minute. Within three days after the application, 99 per cent of the caterpillars in the Troy grove were dead and strewn on the ground.

### GOODING COLLEGE OFFERS \$50 SCHOLARSHIP PRIZE

Though organized less than fifty years ago, Gooding College had an enrollment of 173 this past year, took first place in the inter-collegiate track meet and in the oratorical contest of Southern Idaho and graduated six students with the bachelor's degree. In addition to a full liberal arts course, it offers freshman and sophomore work, the same as given in the best college and state universities, to those intending to major in engineering, medicine, law, agriculture and similar subjects.
