Chair Once Used by Primate Bramhall Restored to Place in Cathedral at Armagh.

An ancient chair which was dedi-

cated recently at Armagh (Ireland) cathedral by the primate was great find, being the oak chair belonging to Primate Bramhall, who came into office shortly after Cromwell's time. For many years efforts have been made to trace the chair, but it was only a few weeks ago that It was discovered to be in the hands of a well-known London expert. The chair was submitted to a famous antiquarian who at once identified it, with the result that it has returned to its original home—the cathedral. At the top of the chair is carved a large eye -the all-seeing eye; beneath it a crown after a miter, and under that the arms of the See of Armagh. Under this is the true cross, and below it again 1661-the date on which Archbishop Bramhall was enthroned. On the last panel are the capital let-ters, "MR.H.," standing for Armagh.
