**NO WARSHIPS TO BE SCRAPPED YET**

Washington, D. C.—Holding the view that the naval disarmament treaty does not become effective until all five signatories have ratified it, this government has taken no steps to scrap ships specified other than the obsolete craft which would have been dismantled in the normal course.

Great Britain, in announcing that no more of her ships will be scrapped until the treaty is ratified, appears to be following the example of this government.

Unless France and Italy ratify the armament treaties within a reasonable time the United States is prepared to revise the naval scrapping agreement into three power form so that it will be effective upon the three nations which have already given final approval—the United States, Great Britain and Japan.

**MORE TAXES ABOUT DUE**

Payment December 15 Expected to Total \$275,000,000.

Washington, D. C.—The treasury has issued a reminder that another payment of income and profits taxes is due December 15. It estimated, a formal statement said, that the payment would bring in about \$275,000,000. Not all of the payment, however, will be in cash, as, under the optional forms of payment permitted, taxpayers may turn in, in addition to cash or checks, either treasury certificates of indebtedness maturing December 15, or 4% per cent victory notes, whether or not they have been called for redemption.

Besides the certificates of indebtedness maturing December 15, the treasury must take care of about \$700,000,000 in victory notes which have been called for redemption on the same date.

California Mayor Sent to Jail, Fresno, Cal.—The Fresno county jail will be the unofficial "city hall" of Firebaugh, Cal., for the next 60 days, Max Knittle, mayor of the town, having taken up his residence in the county bastille for that period. He was convicted on a charge of bootlegging.
