The immediate occasion of the act was the attempt of the prisoner's brother to take a horse which Joel claimed. As the former was saddling the animal the other ordered him to leave the horse in the stable. As this demand was refused the man who is now a convict went into the house, brought out a rifle and fired into his brother's body. The wounded man narrowly escaped death, and is now suffering from partial paralysis as a result of the wound.
