IS THERE A REASON?

Here are Some Answers to the Malheur Enterprise's Question—"Why Does not Malheur County Get Its Share of the \$15,000,000 Going out Annually for Fattened Livestock and Packing House Products"

To the Editor:
Referring to your article asking why the farmers did not get their share of the Fifteen Million Dollars that was spent on Packing House Products and Livestock imported to the Northwest, will say that the writer knows of several people not very far away who have tried shipping to Portland Market and found that they could always get rid of their fat stuff but could not dispose of stuff that was not ready for the block.
In the Eastern Markets you can also sell your cubs as there are buyers at the yards for just that kind of stuff. A farmer in this valley cannot compete with the farmer of the East in selling to Eastern Markets and he cannot afford to ship back half of his livestock because the yards at Portland will not accept them. There is no money in this kind of business when a farmer can sell his hay in the stack at \$8.00 ton and his grain at \$1.50 per hundred.

In your last edition you asked the question, "Why don't we get our share of the \$15,000,000 going out of the state annually for fattened livestock and packing house products?"
My opinion is that Economics are unfortunately overlooked in the development of a new country. The original Pioneer practiced the most rigid economy by depriving himself of everything possible that could not be produced at home, and as a result from self-dependence prospered.
A second period arrives which might be termed speculative. 'Tis the awaiting of new people with new money that we may send out to bring in everything to eat and wear, and this period in time has come to a common end in all countries.
With the dawning era values are increased by earning capacity, and conservation of all resources will turn the balance of trade immediately back. Malheur county with an empire of 5,000,000 acres of perpetual pasture lands lying adjacent to the richest body of irrigable land in the west, is destined to be a common-
