VALE SHOULD GET SHARE OF \$3,000,000 BEING PAID FOR PORTLAND CEMENT
Oregon Pays Other States Millions for the Very Things She Has Undeveloped--Two Hundred Barrel Plant Proposed for Vale Some Months Ago Would be Great Paying Institution--Hills Surrounding Vale Abound With all Ingredients Necessary

That not one barrel of the 1,500,000 barrels of Portland cement, valued at \$3,000,000, used in Portland territory last year, was manufactured in the state is one of the startling statements in the new bulletin to "The Economic Mineral Resources of Oregon" by Prof. H. M. Park of the O. A. C. school of mines, who is also director of the State Bureau of Mines, which is publishing the new work at Salem.

Although Oregon produced approximately \$4,000,000, worth of geological product in 1910, more than \$12,000,000 worth were imported from other states and foreign countries, over three-fourths of which could have been produced within the state.

California and Washington have for some years spent thousands of dollars investigating the mineral resources of their territory, while Oregon has done practically nothing in this direction.
