

Whose recent tragic death, through the accidental discharge of a rifle, has been already announced by the county press, was born in Crawford county Illlinois, Aug. 6, 1852. He was the sixth in a family of seven-five boys and two girls. In 1858, when Jesse was only six, his father died, heur, State of Oregon, particularly family to the mother; a woman of unusual strength of character, who, living with her chilrden on rented farms, contrived by industry and good business sense to support her family and keep her children together.
