# **GROW MORE APPLES** SAYS COUNTY FRUIT INSPECTOR LACKEY

Malheur and Willow Valleys Greatest Orchard Country excellent work they displayed kept in the World---Cites Some of the Profits Made in This Section

Malheur County is one of the few favored places for the growing of apples, alfalfa and potatoes according ONTARIO POLO to statements made by County fruit Inspector Lackey at a recent sesssion of the local Chamber of Com-

"I would like to see more orchards in this county and especially in this section for I consider this part of the and especially adapted to fruit growing.

"Since I have been appointed County Fruit Inspector I have come to believe that the San Jose scale is a blessing because it has made people take care of their orchards. For instance, the Ironside orchards, in the northwestern part of this cou ty, which are entirely free from any diseases are allowed to grow in any old way. The orchards in that section get no care and they are practically worse than where orchards have been infected with the scale. spraying is good for trees for it serves as a tonic. Trees must be sprayed and thinned out if the grower wants better fruit."

"I can cite you cases not far from here where orchards have been well cared for and in every case they have been great money makers.

"The Tussing orchard across the river from Ontario has been making its owner \$1000 per acre, and the Sargent orchard which is about 12 to 14 years of age has been making \$800 per acre. This not only shows that it pays to care for the orchards but that our land is valuable for growing of fruit. "Few states can grow good apples and I can frankly say that there will never be an over supply for the simple reason that every man can't raise good apples and that every section is not a good apple country. Commercial apples will always have a market, and knowing that this section raises the finest quality of apples, we should get busy and plant orchards.
