SUES MINING COMPANY FOR MONEY DUE

Plaintiff Says in Complaint That Board Bills Have not Been Paid Since First of March--The Plaintiff run Boarding House in Basin

In order to recover money due them by the Humboldt Mining Co., Mrs. Sarah E. Flint and husband have during the past few days filed a complaint in the circuit court against that mining company.

The complaint stated that the plaintiffs have been running a boarding house for men working in the mines of the Mormon Basin; that the defendants agreed to pay \$200 for the improvements necessary on the building and also agreed to pay \$1 per day for each employed miner for board while working for the defendant and for transients 50 cents per meal.

The complaint goes on further to state that all the money had been paid up to March 1, 1912 except \$50, and that since then the amount due the plaintiffs has run up to \$591.19. R. G. Wheeler is the attorney for the plaintiffs.
