ture of 216 degrees, with rent a negligible factor, with a large local source for shirts, collars, bedding, towels and other clothing to wash, and one of the best laundry plants west of the Mississippi river, convenient to the county seat town and the railroad, a majority of the laundry patrons of Vale are agreed that the failure to have a laundry establishment in Vale is due either to the lack of knowledge of the business, disinclination to run a laundry in Vale, or dearth of effort to get the laundry business to which the Vale hot wells laundry is rightfully entitled.

Vale should not be sending its laundry elsewhere. Instead, with the magnificent local facilities for washing soiled linen and woolsens, Ontario, Nyssa, Jamieson, Brogan and a half dozen other places should be sending their laundry work to Vale. And it is only a matter of time, a very short time, it is to be hoped, before the laundry here will be reopened in the right way.
