ANTWERP LEVY IS \$100,000,000

London.-Germany has imposed a fine of £28,000,000 (\$100,000,000) on Antwerp as a war indemnity.

The population of Antwerp is about 292,000. The levy, therefore, is approximately \$342 per capita.

A dispatch to the Reuter Telegram Company from Amsterdam says that General von Bessler, commander of the German troops that captured Antwerp, has issued the following pro-

"To the inhabitants of Antwerp: The German army has entered your city as conquerors. No citizen shall be harmed and your property shall be spared if you refrain from hostile acts. All refractions will be punished according to the law of war and may lead to the demolition of your beautiful city."

It is said that the German soldiers are active in mastering the fire in thist a town that always pulls Antwerp. Only public buildings were damaged. No prominent church was struck by a shell.
