### IF THE ROAD BONDS FAIL

We hate to argue in the negative but sometimes it pays to look at a situation from both sides as well as squarely in the face. The Malheur County Development League with a membership of several hundred progressive ranchers, stockmen, business and professional men has by petition of the people of Malheur county presented a proposal to the county court who have accordingly ordered a special election to raise \$230,000 for the building of better roads throut Malheur county. Most of this money will be matched several times over by the State Federal road funds now available. The roads provided for by the petition will serve far the major portion of the county, wealth, population and travel needs considered. The improvement of these roads will leave more funds for the improvement of other roads and the present program having been formed and adopted by representatives from practically every precinct in the county in so far as possible is as equitable and comprehensive as was possible to work out. The State Highway Commission to the delegates from Malheur county, who appeared before them in Portland, gave their word that they would cooperate with Malheur county in the building of the proposed state highways if Malheur county would do her part with a local bond issue.

Should the bonds fail the highway commission will be released of its pledge to build the highway thru Malheur county. Should the bond issue fail Malheur county will be branded as the most backward section of the May 10-31 state. Should the bond issue fail the country court would naturally be discouraged in trying to improve the road conditions thruout the county. Should the bond issue fail at this time it would probably cost the people of Malheur county the loss of a million dollars of state and federal money which is now available and which is being more and more contended for. Should the bond issue fail it would likely take several years before another program could be worked out that would meet with support of the various precincts; and in the meanwhile several times the amount of the bond issue would be paid to the "God of Mossbackism" in the form of a bad

There is every indication that the bond issue will carry four or five to one, and it will if the people who recognize the envestment value in better roads realize the necessity of their voting at this election and preventing the possibility of a defeat by default. Why not make it a unanimous 100 per cent election.

PURE FABRIC LAW IS NECESSITY The Harney and Malheur County Woolgrowers Organization has with other sheepmen throout the West been waging a fight for a pure fabric law the effect of which will be more to the interests of the public and the reliable textile manufacturers than to the sheepmen; but will indirectly help standardize their products and develop a bettter market for wool. The Enterprise thoroughly recommends the passage of the proposed law and suggests that the Vale Chamber of Commerce, the Ontario commercial Club, The Commercial Organization in Nyssa, Jordan Valley, the Precinct Development Leagues thruout the county and the Malheur County Development League pass resolutions endorsing this law, having same sent to Frant McKnight, Vale, Oregon, Secretary of the Harney and Malheur Counties Woolgrowers organization, to the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce" at Portland, Oregon, to the Congressman Sinnott and Senators Chamberlain and McNary in Washington, asking their aid in the matter.
