## OREGON NEWS NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Principal Events of the Week Briefly Sketched for Information of Our Readers.

Newport postoffice will be second class after July 1.

Mayor Albin of Salem has announced his intention of resigning to take up farming.

Sheridan was represented at the Portland Victory Rose Festival by a girls' band of 24 pieces.

A chapter of the American Legion has been formed by the returned soldiers of Klamath county.

The school board asks the people of Portland to vote next Saturday on a bond issue of \$2,500,000.

B. F. Jones, state representative from Lincoln and Polk counties, has resigned as mayor of Newport.

The mill of the Hardwood Lumber company at Albany was destroyed by fire, entailing a loss of \$10,000.

The 47th annual reunion of the Oregon Pioneer association was opened in the Portland auditorium Thursday, June 19.

Ralph Tudor of Satehern, Or., was appointed to West Point military academy by Senator Chamberlain and will enter immediately.

A new deposit of gold has been discovered on the beach at Newport near the old life saving station and is causing much excitement.

Influenza is reaching worrying proportions at Hood River. Scores of residents of the county have fallen victims to the epidemic.

Corvallis carpenters have recently formed a union and henceforth will ask for \$6 per day of eight hours. The wage was formerly \$5.

Fifty business men and dairymen met at Yamhill and took preliminary steps toward organizing a cooperative creamery and cheese factory.

Two fatalities are included in the list of 460 accidents reported to the state industrial accident commission for the week ending June 12.

The store of the Hill Hardware company at Harrisburg was broken into and goods to the value of \$200 and \$100 in cash were taken by the robber.

Two thousand out-of-town Victory Rose Festival guests were accommodated in Portland private homes, according to statistics compiled at the housing bureau.

The Roach Timber company, holder of 55,000 acres of timber in Douglas county, will soon begin the construction of 20 miles of railroad and two large sawmills in Sutherlin valley.

The Dalles entertained delegates to the G. A. R. convention which met there Tuesday. The soldiers of the civil war were welcomed warmly by the residents and an enjoyable program arranged.

Colonel John L. Leader, military commandant and instructor at the University of Oregon, has tendered his resignation to President Campbell and will leave at the end of the term for British Columbia.

The oil possibilities of Coos county are to be investigated thoroughly. Senator McNary has sent word to the North Bend chamber of commerce that he has arranged for a government man to come to this locality for the purpose.

Marion McClain of Eugene has been selected as successor to Dean H. Walker as graduate manager of student activities at the University of Oregon. Mr. McClain is a graduate with the class of 1906 and has been in business in Eugene since.

The need for \$125,000 worth of repairs, reconstruction and improvements on the Central Oregon irrigation project is given as the chief reason for an advance from 80 cents to \$2 per acre in maintenance fees charged settlers.

## Iowa Boasts Famous Trio of Cows



MISS PIETERJE ALEXINA 2nd

If there is one state in American which is making a bold and successful bid for honors in the Holstein-Friesian cattle breeding industry, it is Iowa. Within the past year remarkable records both for short and long-time tests have been reported from the leading Holstein farms in this state, and while the making of 40-lb. 7-day butter records is not all that a dairy cow is expected to do, yet the fact remains that for one cow to produce milk containing sufficient fat to make over 40 lbs butter in one week entitles that cow to the honor of being classified among the great cows of the breed.

The first Iowa cow to make an official 7-day record of over 40 lbs. butter is Nancy Lucy Hengerveld 277796. "Nancy" is a daughter of Woodcrest Hengerveld De Kol 46514, (son of the first century sire of the breed, Hengerveld De Vol), with 48 A. R. O. daughters and several proven sons to his credit. Her dam is Nancy Spofford 51336, an A. R. O. cow of show-ring fame, and a grand champion at many state fairs, with six daughters and three sons in the Advanced Registry.

Nancy Lucy Hengerveld made her record of 820.2 lbs. milk, 40.05 lbs. butter at 6 years of age. She has eight half sisters, all by the same sire, in the Maxwell Farm herd, and three of them have made over 30 lbs. butter each in 7-day tests.

With the big record season in full swing it was not at all surprising that

the challenge of the Maxwell Farm had been accepted, and the 7-day honors wrested from Nancy Lucy Hengerveld, though only by a very small margin. Miss Pieterje Alexina 2d 195788, another six-year-old Holstein, owned by Messrs. Hargrove & Arnold, of Norwalk, Iowa, was the second cow in the state to pass the 40-lb. mark. Her milk production for 7 days is officially reported as 862 lbs., containing 32.464 lbs. fat, equal to 40.58 lbs. butter. Since these figures were announced she has increased her record to over 42 lbs. "Miss Pieterje" was admitted to the Advanced Registry at 11 m. 24d., when she produced under official test 321 lbs. milk, 13.96 lbs. butter in 21 days. A year later she made a record of over 16 lbs. butter from 299.8 lbs. milk, her fat test showing 4.29 per cent. When 4 years of age she produced 428.3 lbs. milk (3.89 per cent fat) 20.82 lbs. butter, coming back at 5 years with a total production of 24,219 lbs. milk (testing 4.26 per cent for the whole year) and 1,290.93 lbs. butter. Only ten other cows of the breed have produced more butterfat in one year, and only two other cows have made 40 lbs. butter in 7 days and over 1200 lbs. in one year. Miss Pieterje Alexina 2d was bred by M. & W. E. Timmerman of Ft. Plain, N. Y., and she is a daughter of Pledge Concordia 58660 out of Miss Pieterje Alexina 157519, an A. R. O. cow with a 7-day record of 17.39 lbs. butter.
