The small electric light and power plants now in use on so many farms all over the country furnish plenty of power for the operation of electric pumping systems. These systems have been developed to such a great extent in the last few years, that they are now almost entirely automatic. Once installed, the pump, driven by an electric motor and controlled by a pressure switch, keeps water under pressure at faucets all over the house. The water service thus obtained is in result the same as that enjoyed in the city. There are very efficient heaters, too, which will heat plenty of water for a bath in a half hour or less, or which will keep the water hot all the time if desired.
