

FEW VOTERS AT MEETING

ELECTION HELD TO RAISE TAX LIMIT AND ADOPT SCHOOL BUDGET.

Nyssa, Or., Oct. 20.—(Special)—A meeting of the voters of School District was held in the school building Monday to discuss the school budget and vote on raising the tax limit to six per cent above that of last year. E. M. Blodgett, chairman of the board of directors, presided. A very light vote was polled, only 13 votes being cast. W. B. Hoxie and Mrs. Martha Klinkenberg were appointed judges of election and H. F. Brown, clerk. The polls were held open until 7 p. m., the tally sheet showing 12 in favor of adopting the budget, amounting to nearly \$19,000, and one against. For raising the tax limit 11 voted for and one against. By this action Nyssa will be enabled to maintain her schools at their present high standard. An adverse vote would probably have necessitated closing the schools.

—for Walter, himself, was accommodated a great many of them, with dollars carrying up to twenty thousand dollars and that at rates of interest running for from 8 to 10 per cent. For example, on May 27, 1905, Mary E. Cooley mortgaged 1,120 acres of land, to Walter, in the sum of \$20,000.00 for 8%.

On November 2nd, the same month in which Walter conducted his numerous deals in real estate, he loaned to J. S. Shuter another sum of money, on a farm mortgage, at 10%. In fact, there are so many records of this kind, showing Walter's activities as a lender, that it is impossible to list them all, but they are "too numerous to mention."

There are these tools of "the interests" who have the temerity to say that Mr. Pierce is a lawyer and therefore not really the friend of the farmer but that he is merely pretending to be a friend in order to get the farmers' vote.
