DYNAMITE FOR STUMPS IF JUDGMENT IS USED IT MAY BE HANDLED WITH SAFETY.

Never Under Any Circumstances Undertake to Thaw Explosives Before Fire or in Stove-Always Follow Printed Directions.

(By GEORGE ROBERTS.) In the use of dynamite for ridding land of stumps, one cannot be too careful in handling the dynamite and the caps used to set it off. If good judgment is used, it may be handled with perfect safety. It should be stored in a dry, well-ventilated place, where the temperature will not rise above 90 degrees F. The caps should be kept in a separate place, as they are much easier set off than the dynamite. It is unnecessary to tell most persons that dynamite should be protected from heavy jars, and should not be stored where any shooting is likely to be done. A few years ago a carload of dynamite was exploded at Jellico, Tenn., by a boy firing into

the car with a 22-caliber rifle. Most dynamite freezes at a temperature between 40 and 50 degrees Some brands will freeze at about F. the freezing point of water. Frozen dynamite should not be used. 


